

2012 MEDICATION DISPOSAL PROGRAMS

Protect your family, pets, the community and the environment by properly disposing of unwanted or expired medications thru one of the programs noted below. Do not put medications “down the drain” or in the trash. They can end up in surface waters and negatively impact local ecosystems. The preferred disposal option is through special events which ensure safe disposal through incineration.

February 11th from 10:00am to 2:00pm at the Community Center of the St. Jude Catholic Parish at 801 North Bridge Street in DeWitt.

March 24th from 10:00am to 2:00pm at the Bath Township Senior Center at 14480 Webster Road in Bath.

April 21st from 8:00am to 2:00pm at the Clean Community Event in St. Johns – the location will be provided when an appointment is made.

June 1st from 2:00pm - 5:00pm at the Sparrow Clinton Hospital Pharmacy at 901 South Oakland Street in St. Johns.

August 25th from 8:00am to 2:00pm - at the Clean Community Event in DeWitt Twp – the location will be provided when an appointment is made.

October 20th from 9:00am to Noon - at the Clinton Community Health Fair at RESA 1013 S US HWY 27 #A in St. Johns.

December 7th from 2:00pm - 5:00pm at the Sparrow Clinton Hospital Pharmacy at 901 South Oakland Street in St. Johns.

The Sparrow Clinton Hospital Pharmacy accepts all non-controlled pills, tablets and liquids year round, free of charge. Please call (989) 224-8155. Residents may purchase a mail back pouch for unwanted medications at most Walgreens, Kroger Pharmacies, Rite Aid and CVS Pharmacies. Please call your local store first for details.
